I arrived at 2770 Davis Blvd to an Inspect Permits call. I saw on the front door wording with the contact information as required. I took pictures of the Permit and the Collier County Business Tax receipt which expires 09/30/2022. I made contact with Teddy Collins I viewed the OCVI's for the puppies currently at the facility. I verified with Teddy that the 73 puppies had an OCVI upon arrival to the facility and I verified they had records of an exam and a new OCVI within 5 days of arrival. Each puppy at the facility has a current OCVI. I verified that each puppy had a record of an RFID. I scanned approximately 20 puppies for an RFID with positive results. I am confident from previous visits and records sent for quarterly inspections that each puppy leaves the establishment with an RFID. I measured various puppies for size to make sure they were in the correct size kennel.

I found the facility to be clean and neat. The puppies looked happy and were in separate place rooms if not in their kennels.

Teddy provided proof of records that exceed the two year in the filing cabinet in the hallway.

I measured the large kennels to be 3'x5" x 29" tall, which is 15 SF. I measured the medium kennels to be 3' x 4" x 29" tall which is 12 SF. I measured the small kennels to be 3' x 3' 2 24" tall which is 9 SF. I measured puppies in various kennels to make sure they were correctly housed. The length varied from 11" to 17". I found according to the Collier County Ordinance the size kennels were of adequate size for the size of the puppies inside each of the kennels. Each cage was clean and free of feces. Each cage was labeled with the puppy's information. Each cage had fresh water available to the puppy. Each cage had a feeder attached to the door with fresh food for the puppy. Each cage had a mat for the puppy to stand on and a puppy bed with soft coverings. I determined the kennels were primarily for sleeping and eating. A large portion of the day the puppies are in play rooms as a group. I completed the check list for the inspection sheet. Teddy Collins signed the inspection sheet. I passed the inspection, I advised the permit would be mailed to them. I have attached pictures to the activity.

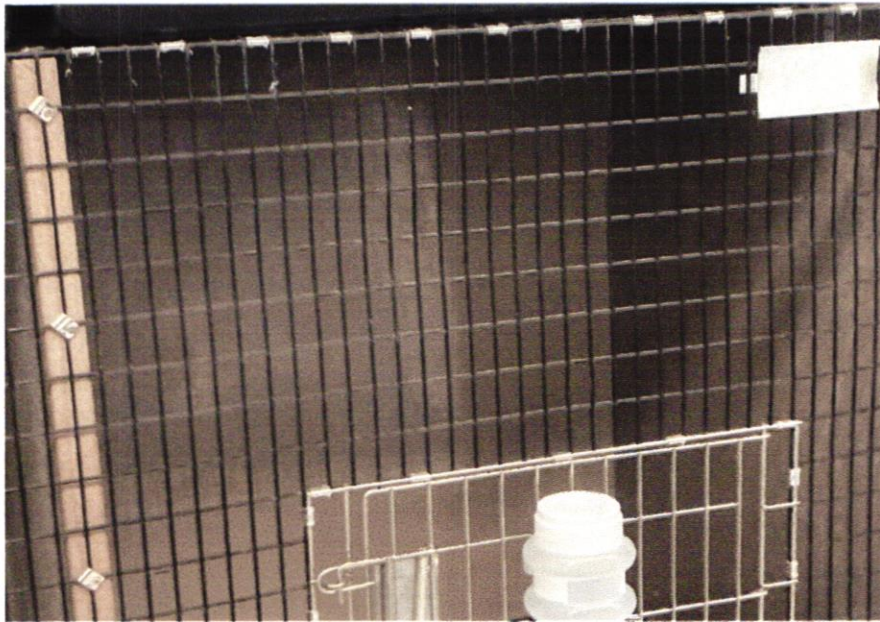
I arrived at 2770 Davis Blvd #40 to an Inspect Permits. I made contact with staff employee Analia Rodriguez. I identified myself and advised I was at the business to conduct a business permit inspection. Analia allowed me to conduct the inspection. I found the business to be clean and free of odor. I tested the water in the tub to find warm water. I saw dog kennels to hold the dogs in temporarily waiting for grooming or pickup. Analia showed me the file cabinet with the records for each dog. I told her to be sure and keep the records for two years. I asked about an emergency evacuation plan. Analia called Kim Collins for the Business Tax receipt and the emergency plan. I waited for Teddy Collins to arrive, he provided me the Business tax receipt and the evacuation plan. He placed them on the wall of the Grooming Salon. I went over each item. I advised that I was passing the inspection. I uploaded pictures, I put a copy of the Business tax receipt on the G: drive for Florida Puppies on-line.

Proper Enclosure for primary means of confinement for dogs means an enclosed or locked pen or structure, designed to prevent the animal from escaping. Such pen or structure shall be a structurally sound enclosure, made of materials impervious to moisture and shall also provide protection from injury and the elements. The square footage of a proper enclosure used as a primary means of confinement for a dog must be equal to or greater than the length of the animal from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail, doubled, then squared, and divided by 144. For example, a dog measuring 30 inches from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail will require a 25 square foot enclosure ($30 \times 2 = 60$; $60 \times 60 = 3,600$; $3,600/144 = 25$). The height of the enclosure shall be equal to or greater than the length of the animal from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail multiplied by 1.5.

2. Each animal-related business or organization will post emergency contact information in a prominent place visible from the exterior of the main entrance to the premises. This contact shall be available at all hours in case of emergencies or other enforcement-related matters.

Dogs maintained in a nonresidential setting for a period longer than three months shall be afforded protective measures. The responsible party shall notify animal services regarding all dogs maintained in a nonresidential setting for longer than three months and shall comply with the following requirements:

1. A veterinarian will examine the animal once every six months. Dogs not maintained on a heartworm preventative program shall be given an occult heartworm test and started on preventative or treated for same.

B. Requirements for sale of dogs and cats

1. Dogs, cats, puppies, and kittens acquired for resale must be examined by a licensed veterinarian within five business days of physical acquisition.

a. For dogs or puppies:

i. Vaccination against canine distemper, leptospirosis, bordetella, parainfluenza, hepatitis, and canine parvovirus. A rabies inoculation must be provided for any dog over three months of age.

ii. Diagnostic tests to detect the following internal parasites: hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, tapeworms, coccidia and giardia. Heartworm detection must occur for dogs six months of age or older. Appropriate treatment for all positive findings must be documented.

b. For cats or kittens:

i. Vaccination against panleukopenia, feline viral rhino tracheitis, and calici virus. A rabies inoculation must be provided for any cat over three months of age.

ii. Diagnostic tests to detect the following internal parasites: hookworms, roundworms, tapeworms and coccidia. Appropriate treatment for all positive findings must be documented.

iii. Diagnostic test to detect Feline Leukemia with the result listed on the OCVI.

If the animal is four months of age or older, the tests, vaccines, and anthelmintics required above must be administered at or after three months of age, but no more than one year before sale within the county.
