I arrived at 2770 Davis Blvd #40 to an Inspect Permits I met with Kim Collins. There is 93 puppies on site at today's inspection. I verified the puppies have a current RFID, I verified each puppy has an OCVI from Ohio. I verified each of the puppies have a current OCVI that was obtained from the vet inspection received within 5 days of their arrival. I found the business to be clean and free of odor. I conducted the inspection. There have been some new cages added, I measured the cages as 46" long by 3' wide by 72" tall. The puppies were in various play areas. I visited with Kim about her continuing to email the spread sheets for the dispositions of the puppies, she will also be sending the health certificates (OCVI's). Because of the volume, she will be forwarding the OCVI's from Ohio and from the current vets weekly otherwise the files are too large to email. The puppies are matched by a number. The numbers are located on the OCVI's and the medical. The medical is listed on the OCVI's.

I did not see any puppies that were neglected or lacking care. I saw the emergency evacuation plan. I attached pictures to the activity. I will leave the signed inspection form at DAS upon my next arrival. I attached the current Business Tax Receipt to the activity and on the G: Drive.

Kim signed the inspection form.

I pended the call until 4/29/23 to verify the Disposition was received for quarter one.

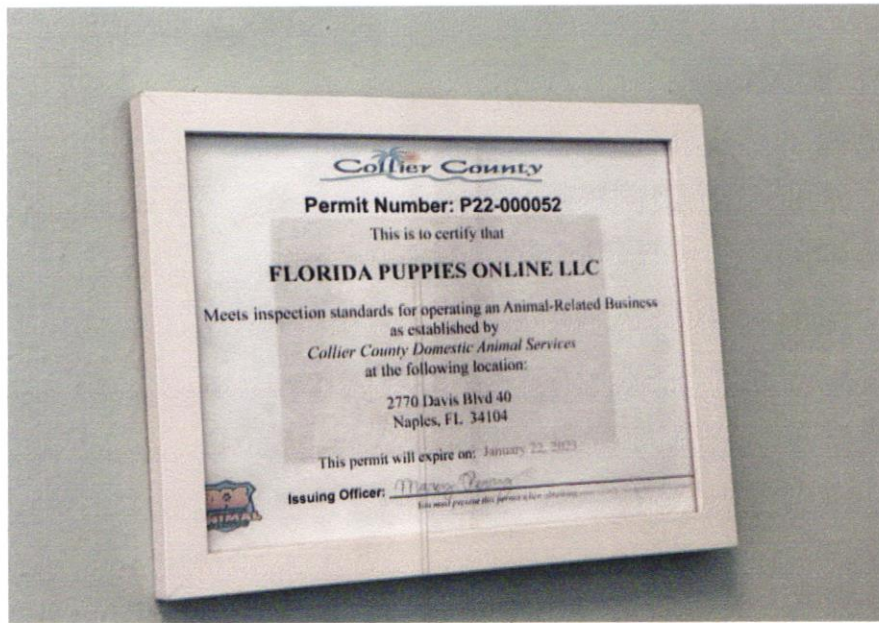




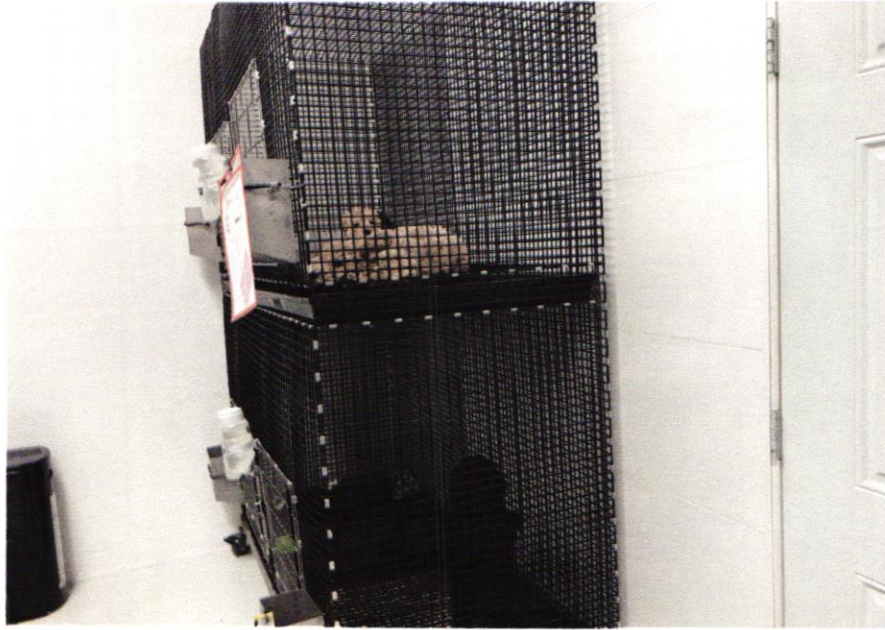


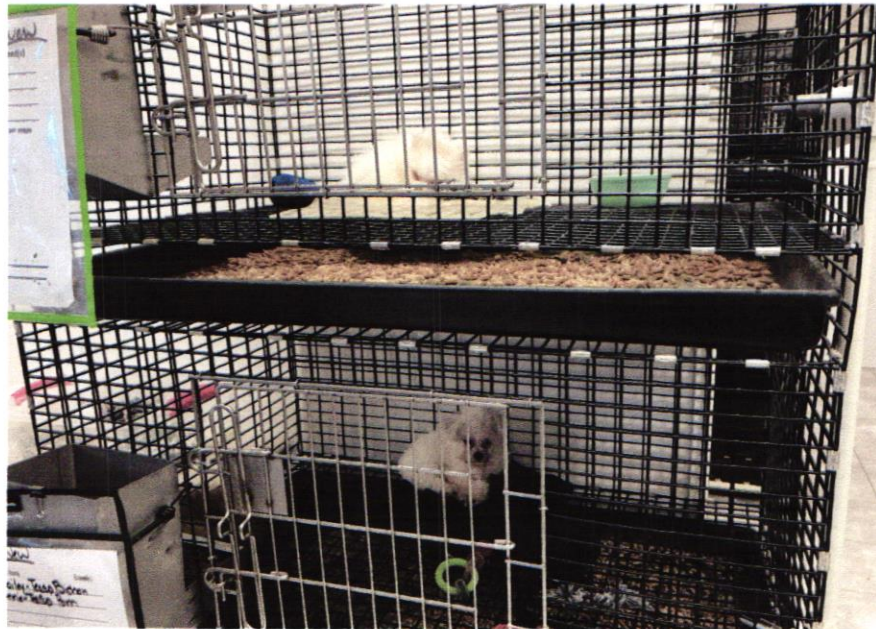
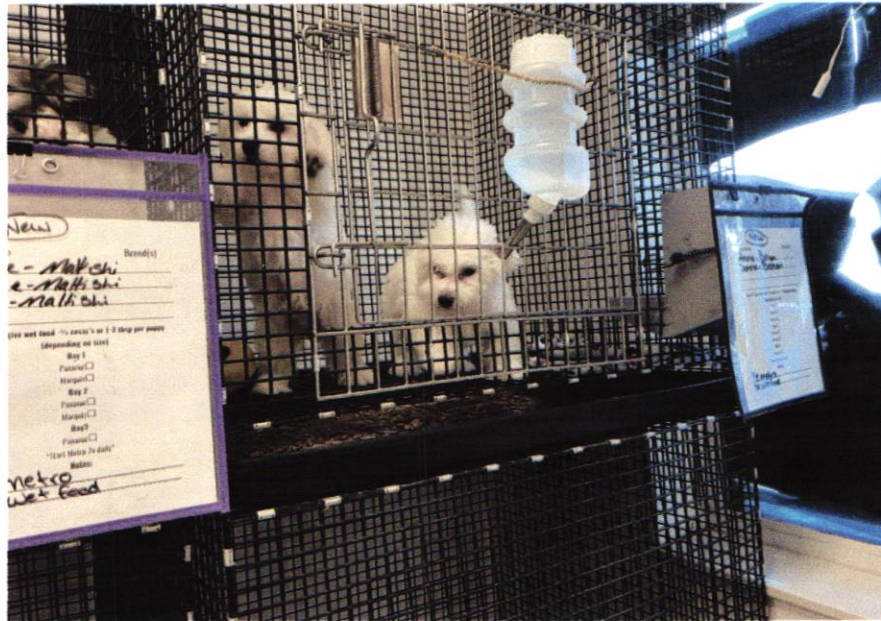
Disaster Plan

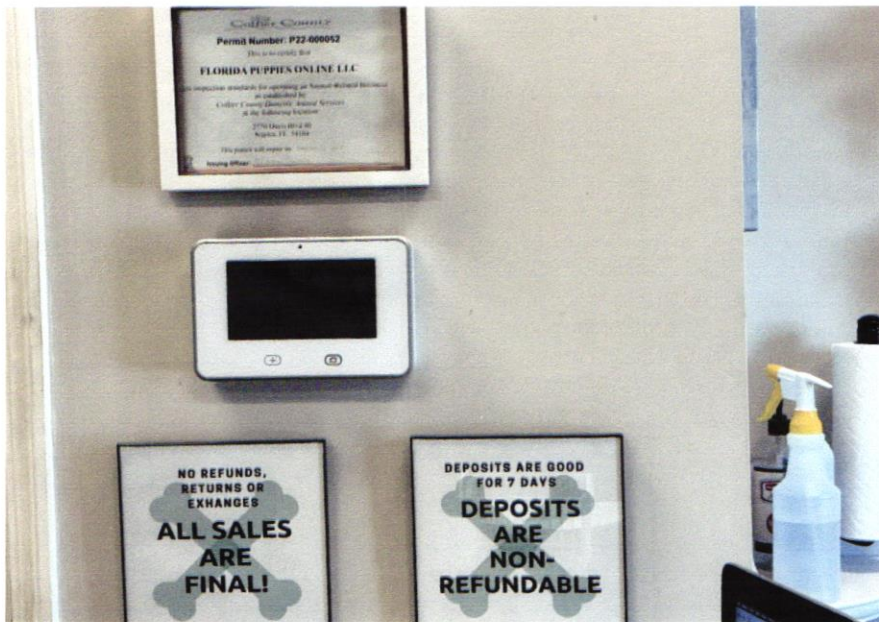

Proper Enclosure for primary means of confinement for dogs means an enclosed or locked pen or structure, designed to prevent the animal from escaping. Such pen or structure shall be a structurally sound enclosure, made of materials impervious to moisture and shall also provide protection from injury and the elements. The square footage of a proper enclosure used as a primary means of confinement for a dog must be equal to or greater than the length of the animal from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail, doubled, then squared, and divided by 144. For example, a dog measuring 30 inches from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail will require a 25 square foot enclosure ($30 \times 2 = 60$; $60 \times 60 = 3,600$; $3,600/144 = 25$). The height of the enclosure shall be equal to or greater than the length of the animal from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail multiplied by 1.5.

1. A veterinarian will examine the animal once every six months. Dogs not maintained on a heartworm preventative program shall be given an occult heartworm test and started on preventative or treated for same.

i. Vaccination against canine distemper, leptospirosis, bordetella, parainfluenza, hepatitis, and canine parvovirus. A rabies inoculation must be provided for any dog over three months of age.

ii. Diagnostic tests to detect the following internal parasites: hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, tapeworms, coccidia and giardia. Heartworm detection must occur for dogs six months of age or older. Appropriate treatment for all positive findings must be documented.

i. Vaccination against panleukopenia, feline viral rhino tracheitis, and calici virus. A rabies inoculation must be provided for any cat over three months of age.

iii. Diagnostic test to detect Feline Leukemia with the result listed on the OCVI.
